## **Course Goals:**

- 1. To foster an appreciation of the scientific method.
- 2. To impart the important ideas of astronomy.
- 3. To encourage critical examination of scientific models.

**K-State Online:** You will need to log on to K-State Online to get access to course materials (lecture notes, homework solutions, old exams), and the on-line grade-book. The system will not allow you to view class materials if you are not enrolled in this class. To log on go to <u>http://www.online.ksu.edu</u>. K-State Online now requires your K-State eID and password to log in. **Personal Response System:** During the semester, we will be using an electronic data collection device called 'PRS (personal response system)'. This system allows me to transmit tasks to individuals for completion. Each student will have an assigned PRS device identified by its number. At the start of class each student should pick up a PRS transmitter and return them at the end of class.

**Homework(HW):** See other side of syllabus for homework assignments. Due by **9:30 a.m**. in class on the date given. Do **NOT** attempt to do all the HW just before it is due – work on each HW problem after you finish the material related to it. Write legibily – if your HW is **ILLEGIBLE** it will not be graded. There are 8 HWs assigned. I will choose the **best 7** of these to calculate your homework grade. Most of the HW consists of a review of the chapter material. The answers or method of solution to these questions are given in the chapter. HW solutions will be posted on K-State Online. Feel free to discuss the homework in groups. Once you begin writing out the homework answers you **MUST** work alone.

**Reviewing for Exams:** When you review for the exam, read each chapter covered. A good guide as to whether you understand the chapter material is to look at the '**REVIEW QUESTIONS**' at the end of each chapter and make sure you can answer them. Also review all the lecture notes, questions discussed in class, and HW.

**Exams:** There are four in-class exams each lasting 45 minute and one final exam lasting 1 hour 50 minutes. No books or notes may be used in the exams. Please look at the **SEAT CHART** for your seat number when you enter the room on exam day. Each exam will be a mix of multiple choice questions and short answer questions (some of which will be numerical problems). You may **DROP ONE** of the 45 minute exams. The exam schedule is given overleaf. Note that 15% of the final will cover Chapter 28 since this material is not covered on any earlier exam. Solutions to exams will be posted after each exam on K-State Online.

**Observation sessions.** I will have one or two optional evening observation sessions. Their times will be announced in class.
